ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014 CITY OF BRADFORD METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COUNCIL BRADFORD NORTH FOOTPATH 155 PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER EXTENSION 2020

City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council ("the Council") in exercise of its power under Section 59 and 60 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers hereby extends the existing Public Spaces Protection Order ("the Order"), formerly cited as 'City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council (Public Footpath Bradford North 155 Wrose, Shipley) (Gating) (No.1) Order 2011' which by operation of law converted into a Public Spaces Protection Order on 20th October 2017. The Council hereby extends that Order duration by three years on the following terms:-

- 1. This Order applies to the public place listed in the Schedule to this Order and is shown coloured black on the plan annexed to this Order ("the Restricted Area") defined by Section 59(4) of the Act.
- 2. The Council remains satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59(2) of the Act have been met namely that anti-social behaviour and criminal activities ("the Activities") have previously been carried out within the Restricted Area, facilitated by the public right of way and that these Activities had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality and it is likely that the Activities would reoccur within the Restricted Area and have such an effect if the right of way was restored.
- 3. The Council remains satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59(3) of the Act have been met namely that the effect or likely effect of the Activities, without the restriction of the public right of way, would be or would likely to be of a persistent and continuing nature and that the Activities are unreasonable and justify the restrictions imposed by this Order and that it is in all circumstances expedient to extend this Order for the purpose of the reduction of crime and/or anti-social behaviour in a public place.
- 4. The Council is satisfied that the conditions set out in Sections 64 and 72 of the Act have been satisfied and has considered the likely effect of extending the Order and has notified potentially affected persons of the proposed order complying with all necessary notification, consultation and publicity requirements.

- 5. Save for the exemptions in Article 6 below, no person shall use the public right of way over the Restricted Area between the hours of 18:00 and 07:00 on any day when the right of way of way will be restricted by a lockable gate.
- 6. Nothing in Article 5 above shall apply to the following:
 - a. The owners and occupiers of adjoining premises
 - b. Police, Fire, Rescue Services and NHS personnel in the exercise of their duties;
 - c. Employees, contractors or agents of statutory undertakers requiring access to apparatus (Water, Gas, Electricity & Telecommunications providers) in the exercise of their functions; and
 - d. Local authority officers and their contractors or agents in the exercise of their functions
- 7. Security gates will continue to be operated and maintained at each end of the Restricted Area by:
 - a. The Traffic and Highways (North). Highways Maintenance Manager for Shipley, Shipley Town Hall, Shipley BD18 3EJ; and
 - b. The nominated member of Wrose Parish Council whose details may be obtained from the parish clerk.
- 8. If keys are lost, or damaged, replacements may be obtained by contacting Traffic and Highways (North), Shipley Town Hall, Shipley BD18 3EJ (Tel: (01274) 435700).
- 9. The alternative route for pedestrians during the times the highway will be restricted will be via Livingston Close, Livingstone Road, Wrose Road and Kings Road, Shipley.
- 10. In extending the Order the Council certifies that it has had particular regard to the rights of freedom of expression and freedom of assembly set out in articles 10 and 11 of the Convention, as defined in Section 72(2) of the Act.
- 11. Any person who without reasonable excuse fails to comply with the requirements of this Order commits an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Level 3 on the standard scale.
- 12. This order shall come into force on 20th October 2020 and remain in force for a period of 3 years unless extended by further order the Council's statutory powers.
